GOLF FOR THE FUN OF IT!

Every delegate and visitor to the Convention of the Rural Municipal Administrators’ Association of Saskatchewan is invited to the ‘Scramble!’ Even if you’ve never played golf in your life, enter your name - and you could be one of 4 persons on a team that might win the trophy!

Please have your registration and entry fee into the Golf Committee (as listed on the attached registration form) **no later than April 30th**! The entry fee for this year is **\$100.00 per golfer** and this includes a power cart, supper and prize.

In order to determine the number of teams, we require that **YOUR ENTRY FEE BE PAID AT THE TIME YOU SEND IN YOUR REGISTRATION.**

GOLF COURSE ATTIRE

Men:

1. Men’s shirts need collars or mock collars with sleeves.
2. Shorts / Pants must be tailored and in good shape.
3. No denim on the course, except for on Driving Range.

Women:

1. Ladies shirts need a collar when sleeveless, and no collar is needed when shirt has sleeves.
2. Slacks (regular length and capri style), shorts and skirt /skorts must be tailored and in good condition. Appropriate length will be dictated by current style.
3. No denim allowed on the course, except for on the Driving Range.

CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL POLICY

No alcoholic beverages other than those provided by the Golf Club shall be permitted. No person shall consume

alcoholic beverages to the point of impairment or intoxication. Persons not adhering to rules will be removed from the premises.

PARTICIPANT POLICY

To preserve the identity and fellowship among Rural Administrators and individuals who are directly involved with Rural Local Government, the RMAA entrants to the Annual RMAA Golf Tournament shall be limited to the following:

1. Rural Administrators and spouses/partners
2. Retired Administrators and spouses/partners
3. Assistant Administrators and spouses/partners
4. Fraternal Delegates and spouses/partners
5. SARM Board Members and spouses/partners
6. SARM Employees
7. Provincial Government Employees (Local Government oriented)
8. Sask. Municipal Hail Directors, Employees and spouses.
9. Golf Tournament Sponsors
10. Honorary Life Time Members
11. RMAA Convention Sponsors

The tournament play is 18 holes and begins with a **shot gun start for everyone at 1:00 p.m.** on Monday May 14th, 2018 at the Royal Regina Golf Club in Regina.

THE TEAMS

Team members will be chosen by random selection of names, although we will try to accommodate couples or individuals wishing to golf together. Teams of 4 will be assembled prior to the tournament.

The thing to remember is that in a “scramble” the players play as a team and not as individuals. Each player in the team of 4 must have his/her drive used at least once in each of the 9 (1 on front 9, 1 on back 9).

BUS SERVICE

We are providing free bus service from the Delta Regina Hotel to the Royal Regina Golf Club. The bus will pick up at the hotel at 11:00 am sharp and will return at approximately 7:00 pm after the meal and prize presentations. **You must indicate on your form if you are going to be using the bus service.**

NOT A GOLFER? COME OUT FOR SUPPER

If you are not a golfer, you are welcome to register to join us at the Royal Regina Golf Club for supper. You must send in the attached registration form, and money to register for the meal so we can accurately determine the numbers for the meal. These activities are scheduled to commence shortly after 5:00 pm.

THE PLAY

On the **1st shot** of each hole all the players tee up and hit from the tee box. The ladies use the same ladies tee box as usual.

The **2nd shot** of each hole is where the fun of the scramble begins. The team decides whose shot of the 4 is the best one for that hole from which to continue play. The players then pick up the 3 balls which were not chosen and move to the place where the best shot landed.

Each player now hits the 2nd shot from where the best shot came to rest (should be within a club length no closer to the hole except when on the green where it must be on the same spot).

For the **3rd shot** of the hole, play continues as for the 2nd shot. The best shot is chosen; everyone on the team moves to that location and hits the next shot.

When the team finally gets one or more shots on the green the best shot is again chosen. Then each player putts his/her ball from the spot chosen as the best shot.

Because having everyone putt once and then wait to choose the best ball could cause problems on the green, each player putts until he/she finally gets the ball in the hole.

Note: If the 1st player to putt takes 2 putts to get the ball in the hole then everyone else can shoot to sink it because the worst they can get as a team is 2 putts.

SCORING

The team score is the only one that should be recorded. Each of the 'best shots' are added up for each hole and the scoring becomes a team effort! No handicap is needed because of the make-up of the teams.

LONGEST DRIVE/CLOSEST TO THE PIN/LONGEST PUTT

There will be 4 individual prizes awarded on three designated holes.

- 1) Longest Drive (Men`s & Women`s) - Your drive must be in the fairway to count. If you beat the existing longest drive, put your name on the marker in the fairway and move it to your ball location.
- 2) Closest to the Pin - Your tee shot must be on the green to count. If you beat the existing closest to the pin, put your name on the marker and move it to your ball location.

If it is measurable, you should take the tape measure provided, and measure the distance from the rim of the cup to the side of their ball. If your shot is closer than the previously recorded one - then you write your name and distance your ball was from the hole.

- 3) Longest Putt - If you beat the existing longest putt, put your name on the marker and move it to your ball location.

“Mulligans for MS”

At the registration table, when you arrive, you will have the opportunity to purchase Mulligans that can be used for your game. A Mulligan is used as a “Do-over” anywhere on the course. If you miss a putt or shot you can use a Mulligan as a second attempt to make it. They are 2 for \$20.00. All this money will be donated to the MS Society of Canada.
